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Education reform is the name given to the goal of changing public education. Historically, reforms have taken different forms because the motivations of reformers have differed. However, since the 1980s, education reform has been focused on changing the existing system from one focused on inputs to one focused on outputs (i.e., student achievement).

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In the Soviet era, Russian was the sole official administrative language and the lingua franca in Georgia as in the Soviet Union as a whole, while persons belonging to national minorities were also encouraged through educational institutions to use and maintain their native languages; at least this was the case for most ethnicities from the 1950s onwards.
